- All parents with Singapore Citizen children enrolled in child care centres licensed by ECDA will continue to be eligible for a Basic Subsidy.
- On top of the Basic Subsidy, families with working mothers, and with gross monthly household incomes of \$7,500 and below, are eligible for an Additional Subsidy, with lower income families receiving more.
- Larger families with many dependents can also choose to have their Additional Subsidy computed on a Per Capita Income (PCI) basis.
