MCLUB LEADERSHIP INCUBATOR CORE 2016 DIALOGUE SESSION WITH DR YAACOB IBRAHIM

YOUNG MALAY/MUSLIM PROFESSIONALS GIVING BACK TO COMMUNITY

On <u>Saturday, 4 June 2016</u>, a total of 26 participants ranging from the ages of 17 to 30 will complete their <u>three-month intensive introduction to community activism</u> from <u>Leadership Incubator</u> (LI) Core programme. This is the highest number of participants to date, a positive indication of an increasing awareness towards community activism. As potential leaders of tomorrow, these young individuals have come forward to explore the areas where they can be change makers for the future of the Malay/Muslim community. They aspire to tackle issues concerning the community such as improving healthcare for those with chronic ailments, and empowering the less-abled through better education pathways.

The LI Core comprises 12 workshops over three months to equip as many young Malay/Muslim Professionals as possible with grounding in community issues and project skills. The LI Core programme seeks to build skills in three areas namely, Personal Discovery, Community Knowledge and Project Management Skills.

As part of this engagement and with the theme of "Setting priorities for community activism", the youths will have the opportunity to engage Dr Yaacob Ibrahim, Minister for Communications and Information, Minister-In-Charge of Cyber Security and Minister-In-Charge of Muslim Affairs in a dialogue session. This session allows the participants to have better insights on community as well as national issues. The knowledge gathered after the dialogue as well as the skills that they gain from the workshops will be used for their upcoming projects.


